
GLOVE Instructor

Taught by the founder of Compliant Technologies (the GLOVE manufacturer), Jeff Niklaus will cover safety, nomenclature, terms, medical, physiological effects, tactical considerations, post-incident, trouble shooting, and decontamination during the approximately 3-4 hour-long instruction. User Manual is included. Certificate issued after successful completion of an assessment. [NOTE: This program offered only one time during the conference.]



Spit Restraint™ Instructor

Taught by IPICD staff, this approximately 4-hour-long seminal, IPICD staff-developed program will cover spit mask application, use, and removal guidelines. Definitions, medical concerns, force issues, and hooding history and definitions are discussed. Each participant receives a lesson guide, Learner Companion, and supporting documents. Certificate issued after successful completion of an assessment.



Recognizing & Managing Abnormal Breathing Instructor

Taught by IPICD staff and Michael Curtis, M.D. (schedule permitting), this approximately 4-hour program will cover air hunger, breathing equation, gas exchange, ventilation, respiration, agonal respirations, and action steps. Each participant receives a lesson guide, Learner Companion, and supporting documents. Certificate issued after successful completion of an assessment. [NOTE: This program is offered only one day during the conference.]
